## Our School

Toowoomba Flexi School (Flexi) is a campus of Centenary Heights State High School, and is a **responsive learning environment** providing young people with an opportunity to engage in senior education.

The program is designed to offer **educational pathways** for young people in Years 10 to 12 who have become disengaged from mainstream school for a variety of reasons.

Flexi is a flexible, supportive learning environment designed to offer educational pathways whilst also meeting the requirements of the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) and the Australian Curriculum.

The program specifically supports the whole young person through our wellbeing program, work skills, vocational and academic educational programs.

Flexi teachers and support staff work together with parents/carers and valued community groups to support all young people throughout their senior years in schooling.

To assist our learners in attaining their educational goals, the school aims to provide a positive, well supported school environment. Flexi requires young people to attend on every school day and implements strategies to improve regular school attendance. We recognise we cannot teach a student well if we do not see them for sufficient time.

Our overall aim is to assist our young people to successfully transition to work, further study and to become confident young adults ready to be active members of the wider community.

## Curriculum Program

Our primary focus is to assist our learners in achieving the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). The QCE is Queensland's senior school qualification and is a certificate that recognises the successful completion of secondary education as well as being a valuable pathway to further study at TAFE institutes, university and to the world of work.

At Flexi our curriculum is an adapted program that adheres to the Australian Curriculum for students enrolled in Year 10 followed by engagement in Years 11 and 12 with Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) subjects. Young people have the opportunity to choose from a range of subjects where our teachers work with each student and their parents/carers to develop a Senior Education and Training (SET) Plan. Each young person will have an individualised program based around his/her abilities, interests and ambitions.

All young people undertake a mixture of core subjects and elective subjects. The elective subjects allow young people to explore and develop more specialised skills in additional areas. Equally, there are opportunities to undertake certificate level course as well as School Based Traineeships and Apprenticeships (SATs) and the University of Southern Queensland (USQ) Tertiary Preparation Program.

Flexi also provides its young people scheduled structured work placement, expanding their practical skillset through work experience. Work experience allows our young people to discover workplace processes and communication, build interpersonal skills and to develop and refine career aspirations.
